### Pakal Dul Hydroelectric Project (1000MW)

### 1. Brief Introduction of Project

Pakal Dul (1000MW) HE Project was initially conceived by NHPC and later on got transferred to Chenab Valley Power Projects [P] Limited (CVPPPL). CVPPPL is a Joint Venture Company of NHPC Limited, JKSPDC and PTC (India) Limited incorporated on 13/06/2011 for execution of 03 Hydroelectric Projects namely Pakal Dul, Kiru and Kwar with aggregate installed capacity of 2164 MW at Chenab River Basin in Distt Kishtwar of Jammu & Kashmir, with equity participation of 49%, 49% and 2% by NHPC, JKSPDC & PTC respectively.

Pakal Dul HE Project is proposed on river Marusudar, a tributary of Chenab in district Kishtwar of J&K. The project envisages construction of a 167 m high Dam, 2 nos. of Head Race Tunnel of 7.20M diameter and 10 km length, an underground Power House with 4 units of 250 MW each. The annual energy generation will be 3330 MU.

Clearance from Fisheries Department and clearance from Hydraulic Division (PHE & Irrigation) have been received in the month of February 2016.

NOC from mining department has been obtained on dated 23.02.2017.

R&R Plan

The J&K govt. has approved the Rehabilitation and Resettlement plan of the project vide Govt. Order dated 22.02.2017 and 07.03.2019, total payment of Rs 39.09 Cr has been released so far in favour of Commissioner Rehabilitation and Resettlement, Pakal Dul HEP (DC Kishtwar) for implementation of RR Plan.

Disbursement of RR benefits is in progress and a payment of Rs37.50 Crores to Project Affected Families (PAFs) has been made so far.

### 3. Status of Private Land Acquisition

Final awards for acquisition of Power House area land and Reservoir area land have been accorded. An amount of Rs 97.59 Crores has already been deposited with the Collectorates for disbursement. Out of this, a total payment of Rs.94.77 Crores (approx.) has been disbursed to land owners comprising Rs.62.00 cr. for Dam Reservoir area and Rs. 23.12 cr. (upto08 /05/2020) for Power House area.

### 4. Status of Tender/Award

The Hon'ble High Court of J&K pronounced its judgement on 28.01.2017 in favour of CVPP Ltd. wherein cancellation of tenders was upheld. Accordingly, tendering process on Package mode for the Project was taken up in following packages of major works and the present status of the tenders and awarded works is as under:

### Dam Package

- Dam Package awarded to M/s JaiPrakash Associates
  Ltd on 21.06.2018 along with Diversion Tunnel and
  HRT from upstream side. The site has been handed
  over to M/s Jaiprakash Associates Ltd. The Contractor
  has started the site mobilization and infrastructure
  works. The status of construction works is as
  - i. DT Inlet- Portal excavation work upto berm at EL 1583m has been completed and wire mesh fixing on the first layer of shotcrete from EL 1592m to EL 1583m is complete and excavation to 1568m is in progress. Cable anchor work is in progress above the berm at EL 1592m to EL 1583m.
  - ii. Excavation of Diversion Tunnel from Outlet Portal is in progress and 820 m (Heading including Portal) & (Benching including Portal) 580m (full width & full depth) has been excavated till date.
  - Portal development works for Adit to HRT has been completed.
  - iv. Excavation work of Adit 1 to HRT-2 has been completed and inserted into HRT-2 on 18.03.2020.
  - v.Adit-I A to HRT -I: The cumulative progress till date is 280.00 m, out of total length of 698 m.

vi.Intake Gate Platform: - Excavation upto EL. 1740 m has been completed. Slope protection work above EL. 1740 m is near completion. Catch water drain & PCC Works in Bern at EL. 1740 m is in progress. Excavation for 2<sup>nd</sup> bench upto EL 1721m is in progress and cutting has been done upto EL 1735 m.

vii. Tunnel Spillway Gate Shaft Platform:-Excavation upto EL. 1709 m has been completed. Rock anchors & Shotcrete is in Progress.

viii. Surface Spillway: - Excavation for first bench at EL. 1738 m has been completed till date & slope protection above EL 1738 yet to be started.

ix. Approach road works are in progress at various locations i.e. DT Inlet road, DT Outlet road and road to Dam top. Formation Cutting in DT inlet Road has been completed and road has been made through for Vehicular Movement, re-grading & protection work is in Progress. Whereas slow progress of DT Outlet road due to very tough and hard rock strata, out of 1200 m length of road formation cutting only 1058 m length has been completed.

x. Approach road works to Adit-I to HRT-II has been completed.

xi. Approach road works to the Tunnel Spillway are in progress and out of 240 m length of road formation cutting of 158 m length has been completed.
